

LOUISIANA BOARD OF MASSAGE THERAPY

IN THE MATTER OF

JINBAO ZHU

LICENSE NO. 5603

ORDER OF SUMMARY SUSPENSION

Pursuant to La. R.S. 49:977.3(C), the Louisiana Board of Massage Therapy (“LBMT”) summarily suspends License number 5603 issued to Jinbao Zhu (“Mr. Zhu”) pending an administrative hearing scheduled for May 11, 2026.

Upon approval of this Order by the Department of Justice, Mr. Zhu is not authorized to engage in the practice of massage therapy and must immediately cease and desist from the practice of massage therapy, as defined by La. R.S. 37:3552. Further, Mr. Zhu must cease and desist from referring to himself as a licensed massage therapist.

I. INITIAL FINDINGS

To protect public health, safety, and welfare, emergency action is required due to the nature of the allegations against Mr. Zhu.

On April 9, 2026, the Board was notified by the Federation of State Massage Therapy Boards (“FSMTB”), a non-profit corporation comprised of massage therapy licensing boards and agencies in the United States, that due to a FSMTB policy violation, Mr. Zhu’s August 17, 2010 MBLEx result was invalidated. The MBLEx is a national examination approved and administered by FSMTB. The notification from FSMTB indicated that potential policy violations included discrepancies or misrepresentations on an MBLEx application, unauthorized access or distribution of copyrighted MBLEx content, or any other irregularity occurring before, during, or after the examination. FSMTB advised that Mr. Zhu was provided with notice and the opportunity to

respond to the investigation and provide any documentation supporting his position before FSMTB took any action.

The qualifications for licensure by the Board are contained in La. R.S. 37:3556 and include passing a national examination approved by the Board under La. R.S. 37:3557. Because Mr. Zhu's MBLEx result has been invalidated, Mr. Zhu no longer meets the requirements for licensure by the Board.

Based on the foregoing, it is alleged that Mr. Zhu violated the following rules and regulations applicable to the LBMT:

La. R.S. 37:3556 Licensure; qualifications

- A. No person shall engage in the practice of massage therapy without a current license issued pursuant to this Chapter unless such person is exempt under the provisions of this Chapter. To receive a massage therapist license in this state, an applicant shall pay the application fee pursuant to R.S. 37:3562 and shall submit evidence satisfactory to the board of meeting the following requirements:

- (2) Has passed a national examination approved by the board under R.S. 37:3557.

La. R.S. 37:3563 Grounds for discipline

- A. The board may suspend, revoke, or refuse to issue or renew a license after notice and opportunity for hearing pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, upon proof of any of the following:
 - (1) Obtaining a license by means of fraud, misrepresentation, or concealment of material facts, including making false statements on an application or other document required by the board.

- (7) Failing to comply with license or renewal requirements.

LAC 46:XLIV §1301 Examination Requirements

- A. Persons seeking a license must first pass a national examination that is:

1. approved and/or accredited by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies, an accrediting arm of the National Organization for Competency Assurance and approved by the board; or
2. approved and administered by the Federation of State Massage Therapy Boards including, specifically, the massage and bodywork licensing examination (MBLEx); and
3. taken and passed within two years from the date the license application is filed.

II. DECISION AND ORDER

To maintain public health, safety, and welfare, emergency action is required due to the allegations set forth in the allegations in the complaint against Mr. Zhu. Accordingly, LBMT License number 5603 issued to JINBAO ZHU is SUSPENDED, effective immediately, pending proceedings for revocation of licensure or other action as the Louisiana Board of Massage Therapy deems fit.

Proceedings before the Louisiana Board of Massage Therapy shall be promptly instituted and determined. Accordingly, an administrative hearing before the Louisiana Board of Massage Therapy is scheduled for **May 11, 2026, 9:30am, at the at the Jones Creek Library, 6222 Jones Creek Road, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, 70817**. The hearing panel will consist of current Board Members. The hearing will be conducted in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, the Louisiana Massage Therapists and Establishments Act, and the rules promulgated by the LBMT.

Jinbao Zhu will be given a full opportunity to appear and be heard, with or without counsel, and is entitled to hear a statement of what accusations have been made against him, to present evidence, to cross-examine witnesses, and to have witnesses subpoenaed. Mr. Zhu may request that subpoenas be issued by the Louisiana Board of Massage Therapy and must send a request to the Louisiana Board of Massage Therapy office at least 10 days prior to the hearing, listing the names and addresses of the individuals to be subpoenaed, along with a brief summary as to what

the individual will testify. The testimony will be under oath and a court reporter will record the proceedings at the hearing, and any party wishing to obtain a transcript of the hearing may do so at her expense.

La. R.S. 37:3555(A)(1) provides that the Board may discipline licensees, both individuals and establishments, who violate the law, and impose fines and penalties. In accordance with LAC 46:XLIV §5501(B)(3), the Board may impose an administrative fine not to exceed \$1,000 for each count or separate offense. You may also be assessed costs of the administrative hearing before the Board.

This Order is entered pending review and written approval by the Louisiana Department of Justice. If approved, the date of the final Order shall be the date the Louisiana Department of Justice issues written approval of the Order.
